This funding will be used to

- For Years 3 and 5 to increase all students' scores in the National Minimum Standards in writing to 90% or higher.
- Refine class differentiated learning plans for all students, in particular a focus on learning plans for students who require support to reach National Minimum Standard.
- Increase the percentage of students achieving the equivalent of a C in English or higher to above 80% across years Prep - 3

Our initiatives include

- Refine processes and assessment tools that track student achievement through 5 weekly data cycles that include network collaboration for English Unit Planning, aligned whole class differentiation planners and data analysis and conversations with every classroom teacher.
- Head of Department, Curriculum to be engaged in coaching and professional learning for all staff for 2 school improvement strategies:
 - Develop a clear understanding about what, why and how the Australian Curriculum will be consistently delivered, particularly for English (reading and writing) maths and science.
 - Develop a clear understanding of the achievement standards for each learning area and the sequence of teaching required for students to be challenged and reach their full potential.
- Refine the Watching Others Work process to achieve school wide pedagogical practises for the teaching of writing.
- Continuing embedding case management to identify strategies for students who show little or no improvement in the area of writing.
- Employ 2 teacher aides for 5 days a week to support the teaching of writing in all classrooms.
